# Programs

## Accomplishments & Impact

## FAMILY LAW PROGRAM

- Hired a Bilingual Resource Navigator, helping clients navigate non-legal services and other community resources.
- Received essential government grants to walk
  alongside victims in the legal process.
- Helped victims feel empowered to leave their oppressors for good.
- 96% of clients did not return to their abuser while working with JAMLAC.
- Ensured that children had a voice and parenting time in custody and divorce matters was always done in the best interest of the children.

PRO BONO PROGRAM

- **48** licensed volunteer attorneys provided 1,200 hours for an estimated value of \$179,588 of professional pro bono legal services.
- One of the first legal service providers to offer EDI CLE credits since the CO Supreme Court Office of Attorney Regulation passed a continuing legal education requirement.
- 4 new Firm Partners join the Pro Bono Program.
- **12** clinics, both in-person and virtual, served over 500 members of the public.

## **IMMIGRATION PROGRAM**

- Provided legal services to hundreds of Immigrants resulting in life-changing outcomes for them and their families.
- JAMLAC legal services resulted in better housing, health, economic outlook, employment, and educational opportunities for the immigrant community of our city.
- Represented 65 Afghan Evacuees as they applied for a special visa.
- Added a Department of Justice Accredited Representative, increasing the capacity to provide full legal representation to more clients.
- Ensured language and culture were not a barrier to justice.
- Represented **104** children who were neglected, abandoned, and abused.
