

OUR VOLUNTEER FAMILY GREW STRONGER

This year, a record-breaking number of volunteers stepped up to join JAMLAC's mission—282 individuals gave a remarkable 3,125 hours of service, a gift valued at \$227,000.



NEW GRANT AWARDS STRENGTHEN OUR MISSION

JAMLAC was awarded multiple **new prestigious grants**, including COLTAF, The Anschutz Foundation, HRCP's Capacity-Strengthening Grant, Next50 GO Aging, Rose Community Foundation, and support from The Colorado Health Foundation.



WORKSHOPS & PRESENTATIONS SURGED 34%

Driven by overwhelming community demand — especially for Employment Authorization and Know Your Rights workshops — a remarkable 3,000+ people participated, marking one of the year's most significant impacts and stretching our staff in powerful new ways.



CHANGING THE LIVES OF CHILDREN

JAMLAC saw a **300% increase** in Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS) cases for children who have been abandoned, neglected, or abused—a vital service toward safety, stability, and hope for a child. This surge reflects both the growing demand and JAMLAC's commitment to protecting young lives through compassionate legal advocacy.

STRENGTHENING THE DOJ ACCREDITED REP NETWORK

JAMLAC played a key role in expanding the Colorado DOJ Accredited Representatives Network. With 25–30 accredited reps now active —and more in process—this ensures that more immigrants have access to affordable, trusted legal representation.

"When I finally made the decision to **leave my abusive husband**, I was terrified. Years of abuse had convinced me that I had no options, and I feared losing my children most of all. I didn't know where to start, and every step felt impossible.

JAMLAC walked with me through every part of that journey. They helped me file for divorce and fight for custody, ensuring my children's safety was placed first. For the first time, **I felt like someone was standing in my corner**, giving me both a voice and the courage to use it.

That relief gave me something I never thought I would have again: **stability**, **security**, **and hope for the future**.

JAMLAC didn't just handle my legal case—they believed in me when I couldn't believe in myself. Because of their support, my children and I now live free from fear, with the chance to build a life rooted in dignity and healing."
